Anchor of "Living Hope"

What made Peter so confident? What made Peter so powerful?

In the former book (Gospel of Luke), ... I wrote about all that Jesus began to do and to teach until the day he was taken up to heaven, after giving instructions through the Holy Spirit to the apostles he had chosen.

Acts 1: 1-2 NIV

After his suffering, he presented himself to them and gave many convincing proofs that he was alive (resurrected). He appeared to them over a period 40 days and spoke about the kingdom of God.

Acts 1: 3 NIV

On one occasion, while he was eating with them, he gave them this command: "Do not leave Jerusalem, but wait for the the gift my Father promised, which you have heard me speak about. For John baptized with water, but in a few days you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit."

Acts 1: 4-5 NIV

"... But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth.

Acts 1: 8 NIV

Day of Pentecost

"clothed with power from on high" "baptized with the Holy Spirit"

Then Peter stood up with the eleven, raised his voice and addressed the crowd: ... "Fellow Israelites, listen to this: Jesus of Nazareth was a man accredited by God to you by miracles, wonders and signs which God did among you through him, as you yourselves know. ...

Acts 2: 14 & 22 NIV

This man was handed over to you by God's deliberate plan and foreknowledge; and you with the help of wicked men, put him to death by nailing him to the cross. But God raised him from the dead, freeing him from the agony of death, because it was impossible for death to keep its hold on him. ...
