"How long will you keep us in suspense?" If you are the Messiah, tell us plainly." Jesus answered, "I did tell you, but you did not believe. The works (signs) I do in my Father's name testify (evidence) about me."

John 10: 24-25 NIV

Now a man named Lazarus was sick. He was from Bethany, the village of Mary and her sister Martha. ... So the sisters sent word to Jesus. "Lord, the one you love is sick." When he heard this, Jesus said, "This sickness will not end in death. No, it (sickness) is for God's glory so that (purpose) God's Son (Jesus) may be glorified through it (sign)." John 11: 1, 3-4 NIV

Now Jesus loved Martha and her sister and Lazarus. So when he heard that Lazarus was sick, he stayed where he was two more days, and then he said to his disciples. "Let us go back to Judea." Jesus had been speaking of (Lazarus) death, but his disciples thought he meant natural sleep. So then he told them plainly, "Lazarus is dead, and for your sake I am glad I was not there, so that (purpose) you may believe. But let us go to him." John 11: 11-15 NIV

On his arrival. Jesus found that Lazarus had already been in the tomb for four days. When Martha heard that Jesus was coming, she went out to meet him, but Mary stayed at home. "Lord," Martha said to Jesus, "if you had been here, my brother would not have died. But I know that even now God will give you whatever you ask." Jesus said to her, "Your brother will rise again." Martha answered, "I know he will rise again in the resurrection at the last day." John 11: 17-24 NIV

Jesus said to her. "I am the resurrection and the life. the one who believes in me will live. even though they die; and whoever lives by believing in me will never die. "Do you believe this?" Jesus once more deeply moved, came to the tomb. It was a cave with a stone laid across the entrance. "Take away the stone," he said. "But, Lord," said Martha ... "by this time (now) there is a bad odor, for he has been there for four days." Then Jesus said, "Did I not tell you that if you believe, (then) you will see the glory of God?" John 11: 38-40 NIV So they took away the stone. Then Jesus looked up and said, "Father, I thank you that you have heard me. I knew that you always hear me, but I said this for the benefit of the people standing here, that they may believe that you sent me." When he said this, Jesus called in a loud voice, "Lazarus, come out!" John 11: 41-45 NIV The dead man came out, his hands and feet wrapped with strips of linen, and a cloth around his face. Jesus said to them, "Take off the grave cloths and let him go." Therefore many of the Jews who had come to visit Mary, and had seen what Jesus did, believed in him.
