- > LIFE IS TOO HARD
- >LIFE IS TOO EASY

Where is the "ideal" testing site for our endurance to grow and our character to be refined as Jesus followers?



In light of (considering) the heightening turmoil and tumult (pressures, tests and challenges) in the world around us, if we are to stand strong in the days ahead, we will need the quality of endurance in our lives. We see from the words of both the Apostle Paul and James, Jesus' brother, that endurance through testing builds character. If you and I will hold on through the tests, they will shape every aspect of our character and personality-with very few areas exempted. Most of these character shaping tests will come in the context of close, committed fellowship. When we don't allow ourselves to get close to people, you and I can cover up the cracks in our character. But when we are exposed to regular, intimate, vulnerable fellowship, we are forced either to back out or face up to what God is addressing in us. I believe there is no greater testing site for our character in Christ than when we are in close committed fellowship with believers.

# CLOSE COMMITTED FELLOWSHIP GROUPS



Have you ever fallen or failed when tested in your life's race?

Have you forgotten the prize (crown of righteousness)?



Therefore, since we are surrounded by such a huge crowd (cloud) of witnesses to the life of faith, let us strip off (throw off) every weight (hindrance) that slows us down, especially the sin that so easily trips us up (entangles). And let us run with endurance the race (agon) God has set before us. We do this by keeping (fixing) our eyes on Jesus, the champion who initiates (pioneers) and perfects (matures) our faith. Because of the joy awaiting him, he endured the (agony) cross, disregarding its shame. Now he is seated in the place of honor beside (right hand) God's throne. Think of all the hostility (opposition) he (Jesus) endured from sinful people; then you won't become weary and give up (under life's pressures).
