*On one occasion an **expert** in the **law**
stood up to **test** Jesus.*

“Teacher,” he asked,

*“**what** must **I** do to inherit **eternal life**?”*

*“**What** is **written** in the law?” he (Jesus) replied.*

*“How do **you** read it?”*

*But he wanted to **justify** himself (**actions**),*

so he asked Jesus,

*"And **who** is my **neighbor**?"*

What does
“neighbor” love
look like?

LOVE *thy*
NEIGHBOR

*In reply Jesus said:
“A (Jewish) **man** going down
from **Jerusalem to Jericho**,
when he was **attacked** by robbers.
They **stripped** him of his clothes,
beat him and went away,
leaving him **half dead**.”*

L uke 10: 30 NIV

LOVE thy
NEIGHBOR

*A (Jewish) **priest**
happened to be going down
the same road, and when he **saw** the man,
he **passed** (walked on) **by**
on the **other** side.*

*So too, a **Levite** (temple assistant) ,
when he came to the place and **saw** him,
passed (walked on) **by** on the **other** side.*

*But a Samaritan,
as he traveled,
came where the man was;
and when he saw him,
he took pity
(moved with tender compassion)
on (for) him.*

Stopped and Noticed

*He (Samaritan)
went to him (Jewish man)
and bandaged his wounds,
pouring on oil and wine.
Then he put the man on his own donkey,
brought him to an inn
and took care of him.*

Luke 22: 34 NIV

Broke through the Barrier

LOVE *thy*

*The next day he (Samaritan)
took out two denarii (silver coins)
and gave them to the innkeeper.*

'Look after him,' he said,

'and when I return,

*I will reimburse you
for any extra expense
you may have.'*

Paid the Price

*Which of these three
do you think was a (true) neighbor
to the (Jewish) man
who fell into the hands of robbers?"*
The expert in the law replied,
"The one who had mercy on him."
Jesus told him, "Go and do likewise."
