Are we more committed to Jesus, or to American Christianity as we know it?



#### SIX FACTORS OF DECLINE

- 1. Inflated: The Church is smaller than we think.
- 2. Hated: Accelerating anti-Christian culture.
- Dividing: Splitting on politics & social justice.
- Bankrupt: Dependent on decreasing dollars.
- Bleeding: Young people & others are leaving.
- 6. Sputtering: Not reaching new people.

#### FACTOR #3: DIVIDING

"Evangelicals are dividing over politics and social justice issues influenced by both the acceleration of technology and a post-Modern relativistic worldview that has become both post-Christian and post-Truth."



Younger, coastal, highly educated and metropolitan evangelicals feel more and more strongly that we should abandon political rhetoric and elevate the gospel by focusing on Jesus' (gospel) message to a post-Christian (& post-Truth) culture ... They see the marriage of Jesus and the American flag as a pollution of Christ, as nationalistic static and extra noise that distracts from Jesus and His Kingdom.

At the same time, frightened by changes in U.S. culture, middle-American, Bible-belt, suburban, and older evangelicals feel more and more strongly that we need to "defend" our rights in "our Christian nation."

They believe that we and our elected officials are called to hold back the tide of spiritual darkness through political influence.

They see the increasingly hostile host culture

as a reason for further political activism, not less.



#### **FACTOR #4: BANKRUPT**

"Unless generational patterns change radically, many ministries will see revenue decreases by 50-70% in the next 10-30 years."

#### FOUR BANKRUPTCY FACTORS

- 1. Dependence on Dollars: "Goers" & "Senders"
- 2. Decreased Giving Trends: 70% Giving Reduction
- 3. Death of the Giving Generations: 85% of Gifts
- 4. Younger Evangelicals Give Less: 15% of Gifts



So long as we rely on a dollar-centric ministry model, the health of our church is reduced to a by-product of the economy, the creativity of fundraisers, and the stewardship of incoming generations that have proven to be stingy, indebted and unreliable.

Giving may seem to be the most non-spiritual and concrete of the church's present crises.

In fact, it is the spiritual consequence of our failure at discipleship.
