SIX FACTORS OF DECLINE

- 1. Inflated: The Church is smaller than we think.
- 2. Hated: Accelerating anti-Christian culture.
- 3. Dividing: Splitting on politics & social justice.
- 4. Bankrupt: Dependent on decreasing dollars.
- Bleeding: Young people & others are leaving.
- Sputtering: Not reaching new people.

FACTOR #5: BLEEDING

The evangelical church in the United States is losing the people it does have and the twenty-somethings are exiting faster than any other group.



THE LOST GENERATION

- Barna estimates that of every five young evangelicals, four will "disengage" from church by age twenty-nine.
- Lifeway researchers have found that of every three young evangelicals that leave, two do not return.
- If this rate continues about five million age 18 to 29 year-olds will have left the church from 2007 to 2027.

Less than one-half of one percent (.oo5) of these young evangelicals have a biblical "worldview"

"The body of Christ (The Church) is bleeding out. We are losing our own kids somehow failing to pass on a meaningful relationship with God (Father) through Jesus Christ. In Jesus' terminology, we are failing at discipleship. That is, we are failing at the core command Jesus gave to his followers. ... FACTOR #6: SPUTTERING

"Not only are we bleeding by losing the people we do have, our engine of discipleship is not gaining new people fast enough to offset the losses and keep up with the rapidly growing population."



"Therefore, go (in my power & authority) and make disciples of all the nations (people), baptizing them in the name of the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit. Teach these new disciples to obey all the commands I have given you. And be sure of this (never forget): I am with you always (every day), even to the end of the age."

Are we making disciples?



Every believer (disciple) was faithfully devoted to following the teachings (instruction and training) of the apostles. Their hearts were mutually linked to one another, sharing communion and coming together (gathering) regularly for (all kinds of) prayer.

A deep sense of holy awe swept over everyone, and the apostles performed many miraculous signs and wonders. All the believers were in fellowship as one body, and they shared with one another whatever they had. ...

Daily they met together (gathered) in the temple courts and in one another's homes to celebrate communion. They shared meals together with joyful (generous) hearts and tender humility. They were continually filled with praises to God, enjoying the favor of all the people. And the Lord kept adding to their number daily those who were coming to life (being saved).

The Simple Measure of Health: New Disciples
