"The person of peace (POP) teaching is an entry strategy to new communities. In the Great Commission Jesus commanded us to "go." What do we do when we get where we are going? We find the Person of Peace (POP). This is radically different from traditional disciple-making methods. In the Person of Peace (POP) strategy, the disciple-maker has one job - find the Person of Peace (POP).

Whatever town or village you enter, search there for some worthy person (POP) and stay at their house (oikos) until you leave. As you enter the home (oikos), give it your greeting. If the home is deserving, let your peace rest on it; if it is not, let your peace return to you. If anyone will not welcome you or listen to your words, leave that home or town and shake the dust off your feet. ... I am sending you out like sheep among wolves. Be as shrewd as snakes and as innocent as doves.

POP open their "Oikos" (house) to discover more about God.
