The early church was full of ordinary people doing extraordinary things.

A cursory look at the book of Acts demonstrates that the work of ministry was largely done by nonprofessional Christians. Several of Jesus' disciples were humble fisherman. Even Paul appears to have been primarily self-supporting as a tent maker. It is possible that one of the reasons why the Western church of the twenty-first century struggles to grow is that the DNA has been lost that made up the original disciple making movement (DMM), that of ordinary people achieving the impossible in the name of God. Well, that DNA is being recaptured in today's DMM that are based on empowering every member, regardless of background, as a disciple maker, taking very seriously (obedience to) the final instruction (Great Commission) of Jesus to His disciples.

God loves and uses ordinary people!

Brothers and sisters, think of what you were when you were called. Not many of you were wise by human standards; not many were influential (in positions of power); not many were of noble birth (wealthy, high society). But God chose the foolish things of the world to shame the wise; God chose the weak things of the world to shame the strong God chose the lowly things of the world and the despised (laughable) things and the things that are not (insignificant) to nullify (supersede) the things that are (prominent), so that no one may boast before him (God).

- 2. Prophets: Visionary activists who challenge culture.
- 3. Evangelists: "Messengers" of God's "good news."
- 4. Pastors: "Shepherds" who feed, guard and guide.
- 5. Teachers: "Light givers" who interpret and inform.
